PROPOSED CHANGES TO MOACAC BYLAWS

Below are the proposed MOACAC Bylaw changes to be voted on at the membership meeting held in conjunction with the MOACAC Annual Conference in April. Changes are marked in *orange italics*.

ARTICLE VIII: STANDING COMMITTEES OF MOACAC

1. There shall be, at a minimum, the following standing committees of MOACAC:
 - a. Professional Development Committee
 - b. Admission Practices Committee
 - c. Human Relations Committee (*proposed change to "Inclusion, Access, and Success Committee"*)
 - d. Government Relations Committee
 - e. Membership Committee
 - f. College Day/Night Scheduling Committee (*removal of this committee*)
 - g. NACAC St. Louis College Fair Committee (*removal of this committee*)
 - f. *proposed change to a combination of F and G to the "College Fair Committee," which affects lettering below*
 - g. Publications Committee (Newsletter) (*proposed change to "Communications Committee"*)
 - h. Nominations Committee

RATIONALE

The change from the Human Relations to the Inclusion, Access, and Success is being proposed to keep MOACAC committees in line with those in NACAC and also to better capture the mission and purpose of this committee.

The merger of the College Day/Night Committee and the NACAC St. Louis College Fair Committee is being proposed to increase the overall effectiveness of these committees and to streamline many of the processes.

The change from the Publications Committee to the Communications Committee is being proposed to better capture the score and purpose of this evolving committee.
